Actors of GCSE and A Level drama are proud to première Fever!, Chesterton Youth Theatre's own adaptation of The Crucible by Arthur Miller: an extraordinary play about ordinary people. Abigail Williams, the infamous teenager whose false accusations sent 19 men and women to the gallows for "making compact with the Devil", is portrayed as a girl with fascinating and conflictual personalities, paradoxes and passions. The claustrophobia of the village in which she and her community live is shown through staging that is immersive, imaginative and intoxicating. It's a dramatic experience not to be missed, and compels its audience to ask difficult questions: who can you trust? who do you blame? which side will you take? Fever shows us the contagious and tragic consequences of a society which thrives only on divisions and accusations, refusing to allow discourse and debate. Tickets can be booked here! 

and reading!







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
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
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
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


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


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
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
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
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















Payment at our Book Fair
