#### Sixth Form Update

This term is as you would expect one of real importance; Y13 start their exam period as of the 13<sup>th</sup> May and so the time leading up to this has focused on supporting and preparing them for when they go on study leave to ensure they are able to make best use of the gained time and that they are in a mentally positive state as the exams edge closer. The sixth form team have been running some whole group sessions on structuring revision, dealing with procrastination, etc, whilst also meeting with all Y13s on a one-to-one basis in the mornings to check in with them.

Year 12 are also about to go into their exam period next week. Unifrog and UCAS are very good platforms for exploring all post 18 options, which students are also familiar with, both of which may also support further exploration.

On the 22<sup>nd</sup> May, we will be inviting all Year 12 students and parents/carers to the Progression Evening. This was a very successful and informative event last year which aims to highlight to families of not only all the different post 18 options available to students, but also how they can make the most of their time in sixth form to ensure they are able to compete in the graduate market when the time comes.
