The other half of the cohort will complete more local social action projects aimed at supporting both the school and the Cambridge community. Our students have come up with some great ideas from putting together donation boxes for Jimmy's night shelter, supporting Women's Aid through a PlayStation tournament, to hosting a Nerf gun shooting range at our PTA summer fete.

Students leave for Kenya on the 29th June and our local social actions projects will be completed on 4th and 5th July.

Chesterton Drama Students Win National Award

On Friday 14th June, a dozen of Chesterton's finest and most committed KS3 drama students were invited to attend the Grand Final of the English Speaking Union's 'Performing Shakespeare' Competition, which was held at the Sam Wanamaker Playhouse in Shakespeare's Globe, London. Two of the students, Laurie (yr 9) and Leila (Yr 7) performed a duologue from 'Twelfth Night', as 2 of 12 competitors selected from over 2000 entries, representing different regions from across the country.



After their performance, unrelated audience members and VIPs attending the event approached us to say 'That was incredible.... You have my vote...You must be so proud.' It was therefore fitting that Chesterton won the Don Miller Audience Choice Award, as announced in the much-anticipated ceremony! This is a truly remarkable achievement, and we are deeply proud not just of the performers (Leila being the only Year 7 student in the Final), but the actors who came to support them, including graduated Year 13 student, Josh. The overall winner – a title which ESU's Judges were said to have "fought over" – performed an emotionally engaging rendition of Hamlet's first soliloquy. He came from Oakham School, Rutland, the fees for which are over £45,000 per year, so it is also pleasing to be able to represent the state sector at such a prestigious level!
