He advised us that every actor needs to respond to every line in a way that's real, fresh and true to their character within the ensemble. Ryan went on to demonstrate this with perfect subtlety and explosive energy as he acted alongside Denise Gough and

Sinead Cusack. One student commented that 'it was inspiring to speak with him and then see what he can do: someone who shows you it's possible to pursue your passions and succeed'.
