Year 7 student **Zevi** is busy in rehearsal not just for Chesterton Youth Theatre's 'Lord of the Flies', in which he plays Percival, but also, for the Tony award-winning musical 'Fun Home', which is being performed at the ADC Theatre from Tuesday 24th – Saturday 28th September, produced by the celebrated local theatre company Between the Bars. The musical follows the story of real-life American graphic novelist Alison Bechdel. It dives deep into her turbulent past, and in particular, her eccentric, artistic and complicated family life at the Bechdel Funeral Home. Zevi has greatly enjoyed being part of this 'family', and he says it's a real privilege for him to have the chance to work with a tight group of adult actors, many of whom are trained as professionals. The singing and dancing in the show is also an aspect he finds uplifting, within a drama which has challenging and even heartbreaking content at times (audience age quidance 12+).

We are so proud to have a member of CYT in the production, and Ms Marston is also excited that her daughter Connie – who has been part of Chesterton performances – plays small Alison. 'It's fascinating to see the protagonist' change from child to adult' says Zevi. He would love you to come on Tuesday, Thursday or Saturday evening when his and Connie's team of child actors are performing. 
New staff

Alternative provision students refreshing their creative writing knowledge.


After going for a walk outside to collect items that signify summer's end, students used their writing skills to describe the items without naming them, allowing others to then guess what had been described.




The students then combined their ideas to write a collaborative poem.
