The contest tests language skills, problem-solving abilities, and teamwork in a way that's both fun and engaging. With tasks ranging from translating puzzles to decoding foreign-language clues, it's a true test of out-of-the-box thinking, creativity and linguistic talent. The competition saw nearly 2000 teams across different schools from across the UK competing in a virtual 'Capture the Flag'. Our students rose to the challenge with enthusiasm and demonstrated their passion for languages and dedication to excellence by coming to work on challenges at lunchtime and afterschool last week.

We are especially proud of the outstanding achievements of three of our teams, who secured first, second, and third place within Chesterton Community College (CCC)! Nationally, their rankings are equally impressive:

- First place at CCC ranked in the top 50
- Second place at CCC ranked in the top 100
- Third place CCC ranked in the top 200

These are all amazing achievements considering the scale of the competition!

Congratulations to all the students who participated, not just for their rankings but for their commitment, teamwork, and interest in languages. You've done our school proud!
